PREAMBLE

Fellow Rotarian Theodore (Ted) Allen Wenta passed away on May 27, 2019. Ted was born September 12, 1963 in Glendale, California.

After completing his education with a degree from Cal Poly, Ted started on a career with the YMCA. Beginning in 1987 as Program Director for the Crescentra Canada Y in Southern California, where he went to camp as a youth and served as a counselor. In 1989, he moved to the San Ramon Valley Y where he served initially as a senior program director and later as a branch executive. In 1993 Ted was promoted to Executive Director of the Mt Diablo YMCA. In May of 1995 Ted was selected as Executive of the Everett Branch which he led for 24 years. At the time of his passing he was Senior Vice President for the YMCA.

Ted was also active in the community, serving in leadership positions with the Rotary Club of Everett where he was instrumental in establishing the AVID program, the Everett School District Board where he served as Chairman, Leadership Snohomish County and All American Cities.

Ted was a man of great faith who served his church community in a number of ways and relied on that faith for support through his final days.

Ted had a unique personality and leadership style. His meetings always started and finished on time. He was a creature of habit and could be found at the same restaurant at the same table eating the same dish (beef, not fish) on the same day at the same time each week. In fact, he never had to place his order, they simply brought it out. To Ted casual Friday meant wearing gray socks instead of his usual black ones.

He is survived by his wife Teresa; daughters, Kristan (Matt) Blow, Paige (Will) Hall and Catie (Jesse) Bowers; mother Deanne McCorkle; father Bob (Gina) Wenta; sisters Tracey (John) Loftus and family, and Terri Hewitt.
