Alfred Bennett IV, affectionately known as “Al” to his many friends, passed away on October 29, 2006;

Al was a member of the Rotary Club of Everett for 45 years and a former member and President of the Atchison, Kansas Rotary Club;

Al served his country with honor during WWII as an officer in the Army Counter-Intelligence assigned to the Manhattan Project and was present at the first test of the atomic bomb;

In his professional life, Al was a newspaper reporter and editor of several newspapers including 15 years as managing Editor of the Everett Daily Herald; also he had been co-Publisher of the Atchison (Kansas) Globe;

Al was active in community affairs and served on numerous boards of non-profit and charitable organizations all of which benefited from his wise counsel and generosity;

Al is remembered by his fellow Rotarians for his wit, wisdom, and wholesome good-fellowship. He will always be remembered for the impromptu rendition of his Nebraska High School song, which he performed at our regular weekly meeting.
