**As a result, he was the recipient of many awards, citations and tributes, which he accepted with modesty and grace. Among the honors were the Henry M. Jackson Citizen of the Year in 1981 and more recently a Scholarship in his name by his Club (Rotary Club of Everett);**

**Bernie was a member of the “Greatest Generation” and was involved in civic affairs and served on the Airport Commission plus he enjoyed a special kinship with the Everett Naval Base and his paintings are displayed at the Base and the ships home ported there.**
